

If possible, use Microsoft Word to write the articles and improve the appearance by using **Insert** to include pictures **From File**. Compress the size of the pictures by: **Right click** on a picture in article; choose **Format Picture**; click on the **Compress** button; Select **All Pictures in Document**; and change Resolution to **Print**. Click on **OK, OK**. This makes the file smaller to Email.
- **Cut off date for articles is usually two weeks after General Meeting.**
- **Leaders' Reports** should go to the PO Box for our Records Officer.
- Remember that we have **thankyou cards** available for walk leaders to use as they feel appropriate- access to land or appreciation for other assistance. Contact the Secretary if you need one for your walk.



### Byfield (Stony Creey) 19 September

Despite the weather gurus promising rain all day, Trent, Athol, Cathy, Carol and myself, tested their forecast and headed for Byfield. Misty droplets hit the windscreen as we drove, and on reaching the day use area, we had our first shower. Undeterred, on attaining Freemans Crossing, and despite a couple of more showers, the consensus was to continue and we started to stumble cautiously upstream over the wet rocks. Fortunately, the rocks had been dry for sometime prior to the walk and we progressed without incident once we learnt to avoid the slippery ones covered in black algae. Around about 9:00, the showers abated, but threatening dark clouds continued to circle us for the duration of the walk making us believe we could be hit again.

This was always going to be an easy walk to navigate as we were only intending to walk upstream to explore the creek, have lunch and return by the same route. The occasional large blue pool forced us into the rainforest beside the creek which provided easy trails, but apart from that, we mostly followed the main part of the creek or rocky overflows.



There were quiet a few black mossies close to the campsite but further upstream, the scotch greys moved in whenever we stopped for a rest. As usual, once we killed about ten of the huge blood suckers, the rest learnt to avoid us.


A couple of the group proved to be keen on photography, capturing moments in time along the creek, ducking into the scrub to take pictures of flowers on grevillea, native hibiscus, and some of the small native shrubs that were in bloom, interesting formations in the trunks and root system of trees and anything else that took their fancy.

Fearing that we may be caught in a heavy shower, we had an early lunch beside a pool that a tree snake had just slithered into in an effort to escape us and after lunch, because we returned much earlier to Freemans Crossing than we expected, we opted to follow the slightly longer forestry track around the hill back to the picnic area where some of us had a swim. Stanage Bay 16/17<sup>th</sup> October

We decided not to worry about 'La Nina' so we set off for Stanage Bay on the Friday afternoon. Once off the Bruce Highway we drove through endless cattle properties and beautiful flood plains abundant with birdlife. Apart from dodging a few potholes, cattle, kangaroos and rolling over about 30 grids, the 100kms of dirt road was in a fairly good condition.

As we conquered the last grid we saw the sign 'Welcome to Stanage Bay' but before we headed to our Camp at Plumtree we drove up a headland at the settlement of 'Beverly Hills' to admire the beautiful 360



vista. We then drove down to the little township of Plumtree and to our camping ground in Endeavour Park which was right on the beach and fairly protected by trees. After pitching our tents we all headed up to the Plumtree Store for a counter meal and some cold beers. During the night 'la Nina' visited us with strong winds and thundery rain as predicted.

On Saturday with sun shining brilliantly and apart from a few fishermen and kayakers, most of us went on about a 14km return beach walk exploring the beaches and hillside tracks of Stanage Bay. The beaches were

pristine and we found some great shells. The different types of rock formation, cliffs, coves and caves were also quite stunning and interesting. We came across a deserted fishing camp just above the high tide mark where old wire beds were stacked up neatly beside the trees and an open air kitchen ready for use for next time. We could also see Marble Island lying in the distance.



On return we found that our fishermen had caught a nice sized blue salmon off the ramp and our kayakers were enjoying the challenge of the tide and winds of the mangrove lined channel of Thirsty Sound. Of Interest, Captain Cook anchored the *Endeavour* in the entrance of the inlet believing it to be the entrance to a river and hoped to find fresh water but they failed to find any water hence the name, Thirsty Sound.

On Sunday morning after more exploring, kayaking and lazing around on the beach we all headed for home. It was good to get away from civilisation for 2

days (no phone coverage). We were told to keep our eyes open for the big green frog which we finally sighted on our left – a very large rock painted green.

Conditions on Cape York for the eclipse are not ideal - it happens just after sunrise, lasts for only 2 minutes at maximum, and it's in November in the tropics - however your next chance to see a total solar eclipse in Australia won't be until 2028. I accept that Walk Leaders are untrained volunteers who organise activities commensurate with my being self-reliant. I accept full responsibility for ensuring my own well-being, and will cooperate with others to ensure that I do not put anyone else at increased risk. Inherent risks may include, but are not limited to, slippery, loose and/or uneven surfaces, rocks being dislodged, falling at edges of cliffs or drops or elsewhere, risks associated with crossing creeks, hypothermia, heat exhaustion, bites, poor or no communications, vehicle failures, and being lost. I am aware of, and accept that there may be no first aid available on club trips. To minimise these risks, I will try to ensure that any activity in which I participate, is within my capabilities, and that I am carrying food, water and equipment appropriate for the activity. I agree to advise the Walk Leader if I am taking any medication or have any physical or other limitations that might affect my participation in any section, or part, of the activity. I will make every effort to remain with the group during the activity, and accept a consensus of the group, or instruction from the leader of the activity if, and when, required.
